Task Cards

Copy the Gameboard and the Task Cards and laminate them for durability, if you wish. Cut out the Task Cards and place them in a pile face up. Each player rolls a die and moves the appropriate number of spaces. When a player lands on a space, he or she selects a Task Card, reads the card aloud and answers the question.
